God's Knocking! Are You Going to Answer?

[Luke 10:1-20 (A very condensed and very paraphrased version of this well-known story.) Jesus sent 36 teams of two into the nearby cities, with nothing more than what they were wearing. Go and teach and report back to me. You'll be able to tell who welcomes you and who does not. If they welcome you, stay. If they reject you, leave. And while you're there teach and cure the sick. The 36 teams reported back to Jesus with great news of conversions. Jesus reminded them that the harvest is plenty, but the workers are few. Rejoice that you are doing God's work of teaching.]

This son of a carpenter, named Jesus was getting a lot of attention around the region, from the words he said, to the wisdom he demonstrated, and yes even with the miracles he performed. As a result, Jesus had a lot of interested followers – some of which were just checking out his message – while others that had a yearning to go out and spread the news.

Scripture does not actually say with absolute certainty how many followers Jesus had at that time... 80, 90, or 200??? Who knows? We just know it was a lot!

What we know for certain is that Jesus commissioned about 36 teams of two – to go out and allow themselves to be vulnerable – susceptible to ridicule, rejection, and disrespect; along with the opportunity to do good. Jesus told these followers to take nothing with them, but only arm themselves with God's Word, prayer, and God's grace. Jesus gave them very clear instructions on what to do and how to handle the events of the day.

Jesus knew his time was growing short and it was time to ramp up the process of spreading that the Good News. Jesus did this by commissioning others to go and tell what they heard – what they observed. Their mission was dangerous and risky. However, in a thankful response for their vulnerability and their ridicule, they cured the sick and watched Satan begin to crumble.

This is nice story, isn't it? Some might even call it moving, touching, maybe inspirational? But the big main point (for me anyway) was that Jesus chose to let others tell his story. Think about it!

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Some may question, why do it that way? Why did he not just do a God-thing and be present everywhere at the same time, to tell the same story? There would have been less confusion in messaging. He would not have had to worry about the potential of various people misinterpreting his message. And; wouldn't have that been more efficient, reaching more people in a shorter frame of time? As an old engineer, it makes sense to me and could be considered logical.

Obviously, my logic is different from God's logical plan. Perhaps a short story might explain the "why" question better. A young friend of mine who is in high school, has periodic troubles with Math. Occasionally she will call me for help, before asking her own mother. Why? Because she appreciates my way of explaining the problem. She feels that I am able to teach her in a way she is both comfortable with and makes sense to her.

This frustrates her mother, who is the ultimate teacher in their family. Clearly, mom is smart enough and wise enough to handle the problem; however, the daughter feels that I view the problem from a different angle. And therefore, it make more sense when I explain it. Regardless of who does the teaching, the goal of learning is the actual target.

This is basically the same approach that Jesus took during his ministry on earth. Jesus was then and continues to be God and could have taught everyone himself, but Jesus chose to let others come and learn, then go teach and share in his place. Jesus wanted us to have a vested interest in our eternal life. Some might say he wanted us to have "some skin in the game of life".

I believe this was the plan from the beginning; that this form of teaching and seed planting would not only bring more people to Christ, but also inspire others to answer God's call of service – for them to go out and plant their own seeds of faith, where Christ is not known. This form of teaching builds relationships and promotes ownership in the process of Christian development.

And we see – all these years later, the plan has worked pretty well. If you don't believe me, just look around all the places of worship and all the people that are believers, regardless if they are Lutheran, Catholic, or any of the other Christ-filled denominations.

Those 72 that initially went out to share that message were most likely friends and neighbors of the local residents. They were not paid – not receiving any sort of special endorsement – they just spoke from the heart and accepted the generosity of the townspeople.

Fast-forward to 2019, that's what makes your individual ministry today so special – that's why it's you who make the best sales people of God's Word for Gloria Dei (or any church for that matter). You speak from the heart – you speak to how God touches your lives – you speak, not as a theologian, but as a Christian looking to fulfill the Great Commission.

But the seeds I'm planting today go deeper. They go beyond seeking those to work in these fields we call New Holstein, Kiel, and Chilton. I'm here today to plant seeds of faith to help the Lutheran Church – leading to a vocation of ministry. But, I have some sad news to share – and it's a story that Jesus shared in today's lesson and remains with us today.

The harvest is plenty, but the workers are few. Today's world is much bigger than the world during the time of Jesus, which means the church needs more people who might feel a call toward pastoral and diaconal ministry. The church needs shepherds for congregations throughout the United States somewhat urgently.

In a recent article written by Rev. Dr. Louise N Johnson, WTS '99, President, Wartburg Theological Seminary, she says there are over 2500 pastoral vacancies in the United States, with 1000 of them being full time vocations. This is alarming on so many levels. Who will stand up and answer God's call to serve in Word and Sacrament?

Being a pastor or a deacon is not glamourous. The people we need in leadership are those whose hearts are tender and empathic. While the pay is getting better, you probably won't have to worry about being a millionaire. But the real rewards are much more fulfilling. And there is job security.

Many of the clergy and deacons now serving are doing this as a second (and in some cases a third) career. The educational process has become more user friendly. And tuition assistance is readily available.

While being a pastor or deacon or an associate in ministry is not for everybody, I'm already confident that a person or two from Gloria Dei would make excellent candidates. Are you willing to answer God's call and be one of his workers?
