The Loving Thing To Do

As I've been reflecting on various passages of Scripture over the last few weeks, a repeating theme of 'greed and godlessness" appears to recur. First, the words from Mary's Song resonated in my heart, (Luke 1); "God brings down rulers from their thrones, and he raises up the humble. God fills the hungry with good things, but he sends the rich away with nothing." Secondly, the words we heard recently from **Luke 12**; "There was a rich man who had some land, which grew a good crop of food. The rich man thought to himself, 'What will I do? I have no place to keep all my crops.' Then he said, 'I know what I will do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones! I will put all my grain and other goods together in my new barns. Then I can say to myself, I have enough good things stored to last for many years. Rest, eat, drink, and enjoy life!' But God said to that man, 'Foolish man! Tonight, you will die. So, who will get those things you have prepared for yourself?' This is how it will be for anyone who stores things up only for himself and is not rich toward God."

While pondering this topic of greed, in light of what Scripture reveals to us, a vast majority of people in the United States live in various forms of prosperity and abundance. Most of us do not worry about having good food to eat or having adequate clothing to wear or having a decent roof over our heads. Yet, there are many in the United States that are worried day to day. They worry about <u>if</u> they will have food to eat or <u>if</u> they will get to sleep out of the rain / wind / cold tonight. There are Continued on page 2

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many who live in the shadows of worry and fear. Given our nation's wealth, this is truly sad. I have however seen first-hand the response of many people, who have indeed stepped up to help with time, resources, and money; whether it was for a need in the world, a need in the United States or even a need right here in little Calumet County. But I suggest that are still more needs to be done for there is an on-going need.

Gloria Dei, through continued congregational generosity and in spite of a very tight budget, has participated in helping those who have come to our doors with food and prayer. The area churches have banded together to help those in need. The local communities annually provide major support to families of critically sick individuals. And over the years, the ELCA has led multiple efforts to help the poor, the needy, and the disenfranchised; even as far back as World War II, when the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services was founded. Christians came together to care for those in need; without judgment, in grace, and abounding with love.

And once again, Christians are being asked to step and help. I wish to personally and emphatically endorse the position taken by the Synodical Assembly a month ago and affirmed by our East-Central Synodical Bishop the Most Reverend Gerald Mansholt, in declaring the ELCA a Sanctuary Church. In the words of Bishop Mansholt,

"What does it mean to be a sanctuary church body? I expect we will discover there are many ways that congregations and synods will live into this decision. I think it begins with taking to heart the action of the assembly and listening to the voice of others. Love of God leads to love of neighbor. Loving the neighbor begins with listening to their story, be that the story of the refugee at our border or our neighbor in the pew. The assembly is not asking any congregation or individual to do anything illegal. It is our right to advocate, our lawful right to participate in the democracy. It is our right to do acts of mercy and extend our arms of hospitality. Those arms may rub up against the law of the land when your neighbor is a DACA recipient or an immigrant who lives and works in the shadows. Congregations need to know that sanctuary has no legal standing. While the local congregation was perhaps once thought of as a sanctuary, a place of freedom from the long arms of the law, sanctuary has no legal standing in this country. I believe it was Dietrich Bonhoeffer who said it is the call of every Christian to seek to know and to do the will of God. These are days for discernment, for seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit in these present times."

I'm not advocating that we take extreme actions of the early Christians, as recorded in Acts 2; however, I am asking that as we (Gloria Dei Lutheran Church) prayerfully address our stance in Outreach and Mission; particularly, as we discern who our next Spiritual Leader will be. Do we have a Spiritual void, when it comes to the needs of humanity? Our active willingness to engage in this type of Mission and Outreach helps make Gloria Dei a more attractive opportunity to a potential future leader.
