Dear Partners in Ministry,

I have always loved the offertory prayer in the liturgy of Holy Communion. It speaks to both the generosity of God toward us and the mission of God in which we are called to participate.

Blessed are you, O God, maker of all things. Through your goodness you have blessed us with these gifts: ourselves, our time, and our possessions. Use us, and what we have gathered, in feeding the world with your love, through the one who gave himself for us, Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, page 129)

"Use us ... in feeding the world with your love." I hope we being used and I hope we are putting ourselves forth to be used, all for the sake of the world.

I write with a word of invitation and encouragement. Mission Support from our congregations has been lagging in the first few months of this fiscal year. We are about \$100,000 behind in anticipated receipts. That, of course, has implications for support of the ministries of the larger Church, including the support we send to the seminaries. So my first word is that of encouragement. Before we get further down the road in this fiscal year I call upon the pastors and lay leaders of our congregations to do all you can to catch up with mission support. I know we have had a rough winter, missed days of worship, and we are now in summer months of travel and family vacations. I encourage you to do what you are able to do.

Secondly, I want to invite individuals and congregations or organizations within the congregation to consider making a special gift to the synod in these summer months. God has blessed us in rich and abundant ways, including with financial resources among us. Because of generous support from congregations and individuals across this synod, we are able to live out God's mission among us.

We accompany congregations in times of transition, difficulty and transition.

We work at being Church together with our companion synod in South Africa, as well as the Wisconsin Council of Churches, Crossways Camping Ministries and a multitude of ministries through the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

We raise up leaders and help them discern their calling through discernment events, Stewardship for All Seasons, youth ministry and First Call events.

We support the work of the Synod Council as they help us live into God's Promised Future and strive to address the mission in the changing context in which we live.

I know people are invited to give to many different organizations, events, and causes. This is an invitation to support the work to which God has called us through the Good News of Jesus Christ. In a world increasingly torn asunder with harsh rhetoric, callousness, greed, power grabs and idolatrous pursuits, we in the Church have a message of God's tender servant love in Jesus Christ. We feed the world with God's love in Jesus Christ and call the world away from that which harms unto death.

In the East Central Synod of Wisconsin we strive to live out this call in Jesus Christ by building bridges of understanding, raising up leaders, listening deeply to one another, and collaborating with ministry partners throughout the Church and community. Yes, we have our faults and failings, but we are cleansed in Christ and empowered by the lively work of the Spirit.

To this ministry God has called us in Jesus Christ. We are Church...for the sake of the world. And I invite your generous support as individuals and congregations.

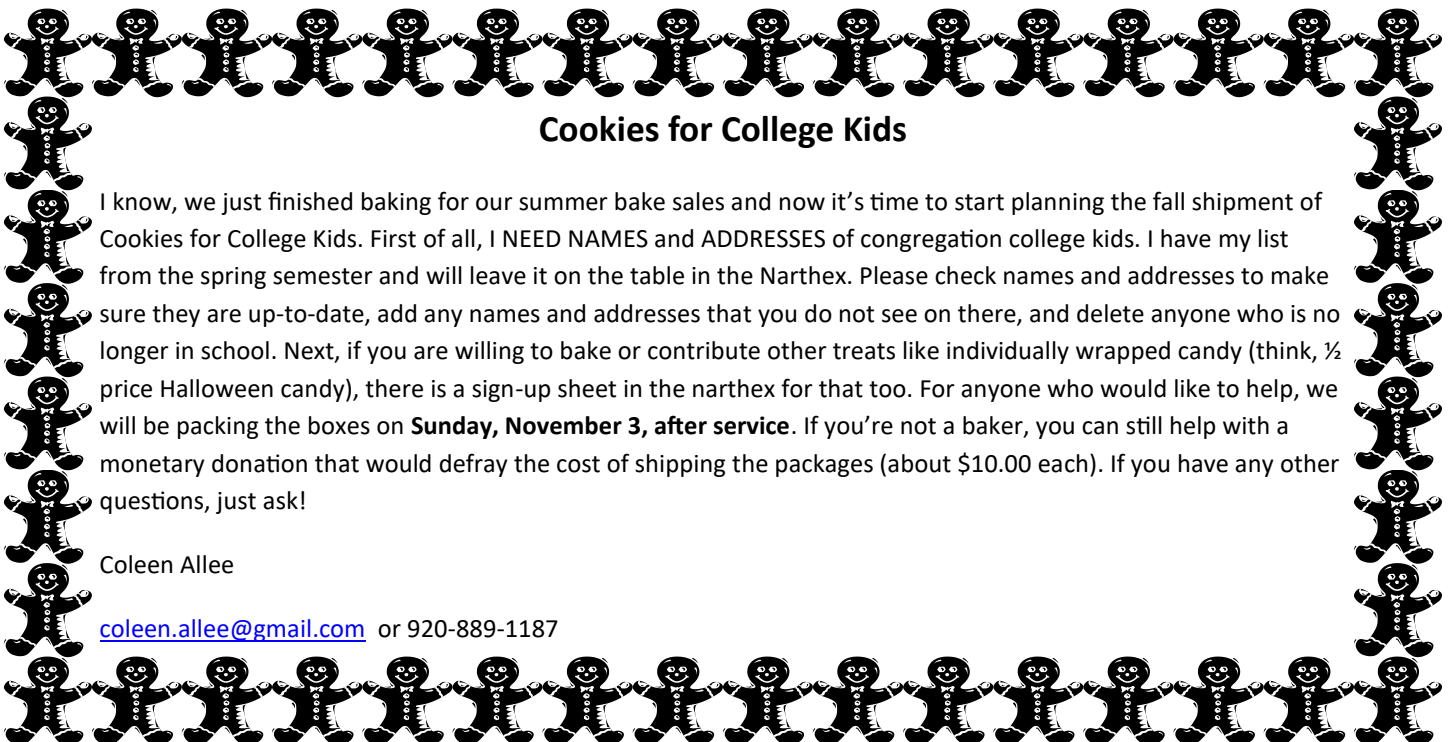

Worship and Liturgy Meeting Minutes

Sept. 9th, 2019

Present: Barb S., Doug E., Dave Kohls, Ruth C., and Raeline S.

Meeting was opened with a prayer lead by Dave.

Dave gave update as Director of Ministry, discussed ideas from Outreach committee that came up at their meeting yesterday. Our goal is to continue to reach out to the community with the hopes of having visitors join our liturgy services. Raeline currently delivers bread to all visitors that attend our services; potentially we can expand that to deliver bread to any new “neighbors” that our members report having moved into their neighborhood. It would be just a welcome to the neighborhood from Gloria Dei. Council will meet and vote on 9/10 regarding the use of our church by the Pentecostal community. There may be opportunity to participate in joint fellowship and other mission projects. Dave fashioned some new candle inserts out of wood for use on the alter which he brought in to show this committee for approval. They will allow us to use 1 ½ inch taper candles vs the big 3 – 4-inch candles that do not burn evenly. We would like to give this a try as an effort to better use our resources and stewardship. Dave will be organizing the Pastor Office over the next couple of weeks and will put together any liturgy supplies that he finds with the baptismal and confirmation supplies. As of this month, we expect that we should see 3 – 4 young people ready for first communion and 5 – 6 ready for confirmation in fall. We are not “expecting” any baptisms in the near future. On Oct 6th and 9th there will be a special blessing for pets in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. Pastor Jim will preach the services on Oct 23rd and Nov 27th. Jim’s current agreement with Gloria Dei will come to an end on Nov. 30th. We will find out from council as to whether it will be extended.

New member orientation will be held this coming Sunday. Barb will represent Worship and Liturgy at the class.

Choir practice will start again on Sept. 11th. Doug reported on some new music that he purchased.

Dee Langohr has stated there is money in the Memorial Fund to use for new banners; thus, Raeline will do some research and bring some suggestions for new banners to our next meeting.

Barb closed us out with a prayer.
