

At the annual meeting, Gloria Dei passed a budget that projected a shortfall for 2021 of over \$17,000. This report is intended to keep the congregation informed on overall budget on a monthly basis. Please reach out to me if you have any specific questions. In June, the congregation set a goal of raising \$15,000 for the building staining project. That goal has been acheived. The numbers above reflect \$9,625 of that in the account and no money paid out yet to the contractor.

For August, income was \$991 greater than expenses. Year to date, expenses exceed income by \$1,647.

For expenses, this month did not include any quarterly bills.

The income also includes the \$400 rent from the Pentacostals.

**Lay School Ministry** - Nealey Janicek is currently attending this two year program for free on one Fri/Saturday per month. We wish her well on her journey of faith and grant her use of the building for study purposes.

**God's Work/Our Hands** - 226 dry erase markers/33 erasers/36 boxes of facial tissue/65 sanitizing wip containers were donated or purchased with \$250 Thrivent grant. Delivery was made to Kiel HS. They enthusiastically received our gift.

**Call Committee Update** - Positive Zoom and on-site interview & tour have taken place. Call Committee will work on agreement and move onto the next step in the process.

**Fall Pledge Drive** - Stewardship Committee to meet next Thursday to discuss meeting budget obligations and encourage members to fill out pledge cards.

**Building Use Request** - Investment Club has requested to meet in our building again. A donation will be suggested to cover costs of utilities. Book Club may also meet again as well. Motion was made to locate the Facility & Equipment Usage Policy and let the Investment Club use the building. Sue Salzsieder volunteered to retype the policy.

**Community Thanksgiving Service** - GDLC will be the site for this service on November 24th at 7PM. Details are still being worked out.


### Committees & Reports as Needed
