At the annual meeting, Gloria Dei passed a budget that projected a shortfall for 2021 of over \$17,000. This report is intended to keep the congregation informed on overall budget on a monthly basis. Please reach out to me if you have any specific questions. In June, the congregation set a goal of raising \$15,000 for the building staining project. \$17,125 were raised. The work has been completed with \$14,853.

For September, the general income was \$2,369.71 greater than general expenses. Year to date, income exceeds expenses by \$5,575 which includes the extra \$2,272 from the building project.

For expenses, this month included \$572 to fix the men's urinal, \$360 mowing bill, \$91 to restock softpull dispensors in the bath-room and the \$222 quarterly bill for banking software.

The income also includes the \$400 rent from the Pentacostals.

**Building Use Request Form/Updates** -Sue Salzsieder retyped the form as a Word Document, PDF, and Google Doc. Discussion was had on making any changes before posting on the GDLC website. No changes will be made at this time.

**Fall Pledge Drive Update** - An email will be going out next week informing the congregation about the pledge drive. Giving Sunday is November 7/ There will be a letter containing pledge cards mailed by November 14.

Water Sample Update - Our water has been sampled by the DNR and has coliform bacteria according to a letter from 9/30/21. While not a violation of the maximum contaminant level, it is a serious matter which requires our attention. A level two assessment needs to be conducted within 30 days. In the meantime, faucets and bubblers have signs to not use for drinking. The system has been flushed, but we may have to chlorinate the water for safety's sake due to limited water usage.

Request of Call Committee - 1) Positive Zoom and on-site interview & tour have taken place. The candidate would like to accept the job, but realizes that GDLC may not be able to afford it. There is a question about the number and participation of members of the call committee. Four members voted to recommend the candidate to the council, but one member has not participated and did not vote. We await guidance from the Synod to continue moving forward. 2) A part-time pastor will cost anywhere from \$41-\$55,000 (salary, benefits & insurance, housing) per year. We hope the Fall Pledge Drive will allow us to move forward. A vibrant new leader will only help us gain members and financial stability. If we do not go forward with the hiring of a part-time pastor, we will continue our capital campaign and continue paying down our mortgage.

- 2) Property— We need to dispose of two organs.
- 3) Stewardship/ILong Range Planning—see Fall Pledge Drive update
- 4) Worship/Music GDLC will be the site for this ecumenical service on November 24th at 7PM
- 5) Youth/Christian Education Sunday School happens when the Hobans are present. Nine children will take first communion on October 24th.


