Greetings members of Gloria Dei; President Mike Hetzner asked me to draft a notice for the newsletter relating some property projects and goals that were discussed and listed just prior to the COVID outbreaks in early 2020. Pastor Eric and the Pentecostals have indicated they are willing to provide labor and resources to do some projects to improve the cosmetics of our narthex area. They have already shampooed the carpet in the narthex and the fireside room. Below is a list of potential projects the property committee laid out in early 2020.

Stain and paint the exterior of the church and shed. Completed via favorable fund drive Inside painting and staining (not completed) what comes first? How to piece the segments over time. What is the highest priority? We know that many areas need work.

Sanding and staining all the woodwork areas of the church. (See above) lot of labor and time would be needed. Some of the sills are in need of work due to condensation etc.

Carpeting (many areas of stains, and seams coming loose and frayed ends. Carpeting in most cases of remodeling etc. come after painting and other tasks.

Finding replacement bulbs for our light fixtures or do we invest in newer more efficient systems.

Bulbs are not easily found, but replacement systems come at a cost.

We had inquiries regarding selling some acreage. A committee was formed and quickly determined the offers were not what was anticipated and we have need for that property as part of our septic drainage system.

We need to establish and maintain and conduct routine facility tasks such as collecting and disposing of trash and recyclables, maintaining water softener salt, establish winter time shoveling and salting opportunities.

Disposal of two unused organs (completed the spring of 2022 at a minimal cost).

Set up cleaning and upkeep sessions. (We held one session this spring for windows and kitchen and the Pentecostals were a big help in this effort).





ENJOY A BREAKFAST MEAL ON SUNDAY OCTOBER 9TH. Nealy Janicek is starting her 2nd year of the Lay Ministry Program. The live sessions are held in Wausau on a monthly basis. I had approached Nealy a few months ago about a way our congregation could celebrate and support her ministry. Nealy will give a presentation at the end of the service on October 9th on what the Lay Ministry Program is about and how and why she felt called to invest two years of her spiritual journey in the Lay Ministry Program. Our mission – *Making Christ Known* – is very broad. We will focus on building community. The calling tree has been revived to communicate important news to the congregation with each council member responsible for a portion of the membership. We will encourage attendance and keep members on our roster.

Committees & Reports

- 1) Fellowship/Outreach—Get your Can to Church was a success with two shopping carts of food donations and \$710 in cash donated. The walk was rained out and rescheduled for next Sunday. Discussion was held about designating a monthly theme for donations healthcare items, food, cleaning products, socks, etc.
- 2) Property—Water samples passed the bacteria test so we don't need to flush our system anymore. Nitrate test will need to be redone. A list of needed supplies, where, & how often they are purchased will be compiled. Many thanks to several people worked to clean & organize the kitchen. Conversations with the Pentecostals about painting and carpet replacement have been had. Quotes will be discussed at a future meeting.
- 3) Stewardship/ILong Range Planning— Stewardship Committee met August 23 at 6:30PM. A stewardship letter will go out to the congregation detailing the positive events of the last year and inviting people to return back to in-person services. They discussed working on a 5-year plan, including budget, to highlight the positives and sustainability of Gloria Dei.
- 4) Worship/Music—Hetzner will arrange a replacement for Pastor while on vacation October 9. Nealey Janicek will present what she has learned in the lay ministry class on October 9. We will have a brunch after service to celebrate her effort and take a free will offering to help with her expenses. Wednesday evening services have low attendance (2-8), but is well received. Motion was made by Pleshek to continue Wednesday services indefinitely at no additional cost, seconded by Lecker. Motion was approved.
- 5) Youth/Christian Education— Three students will take confirmation classes on Wednesdays from 5:30-6:30 PM. Sunday School will resume in September lead by the Hobans.

Piggly Wiggly Receipts


