For December, the general income was approximately \$2,000 less than general expenses. For the year, income exceeds expenses by \$4.824.

December expenses included \$917 for 2023 workers comp insurance coverage, \$886 for the water heater fix from April, \$174 town of New Stein tax bill, \$201 quarterly payment for our banking software and \$30 for the yearly water sample.

Gloria Dei purchased ELCA Good Gifts with the \$500 benevolence donation from last month. The money went towards safe water projects, live stock and seeds.

**President's Report**—Reports are due for the annual meeting to be held on January 29 immediately after service. Agenda was discussed and approved. We need 25 members for a quorum. We will meet in the hall for a light breakfast during the meeting. Please bring a dish to share. Candidates for council are almost complete-still need one at-large member.
