Worship Committee

Return to pre-COVID communion is coming. Starting March 12 wine and wafers will be offered at the altar. We have 3 volunteers thus far for designated Sundays of the month. To offer this every Sunday, we need two more volunteers for 1st &5th Sundays. Each person will volunteer for a designated Sunday in the month. There will not be a rotation but rather a commitment to the role on a specific Sunday of the month.

We'll be using wafers rather than Luther's Bread. There will be a change for grape juice as well. We will continue to use the pre-packaged product that has been used for communion for grape juice in the tray with the wine cups. The prepackaged will still be available in the narthex as well. Why the change?? The white grape juice is now only available in a 2L bottle. Making it impractical to use, as the open time of the product is 10 days.

Until now, the person reading has been performing the greeting and usher roles as well. As we've returned to worship in the sanctuary and now communion at the altar, more volunteers would be wonderful. Would you like to "Greet" specific Sunday each month?
